For years the Darlington Community Pool has provided a wholesome environment for children and adults to play, exercise, and learn the life-saving skill of swimming. Built in 1958, the current pool is 62 years old. The normal life span of a community pool is approximately 40 years. Despite renovations in 1986 and again in 2000, the pool no longer meets required safety and operational codes.

And according to a study conducted in 2018, nearly \$3 million would be needed to bring the 1958 pool up to current standards. Does it make sense to invest such massive resources into an aging pool?

The current community pool suffers from:

- The chemical disinfection and filtration system need updating.
- Hazards from shifting deck and rough pool vessel finish.
- Lack of compliance with ADA and OSHA codes.
- Pool leaks approximately 6,000 gallons of water daily costing the city approximately \$1,500 per year.

The time is NOW. We must do more than costly repairs which will only provide a temporary fix of a pool that has outlived its original design and construction.

Breakdown of Current Darlington Pool Issues



- ► Bathhouse is not compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) or International Building Code (IBC) standards
- ► Concrete deck is uneven and unsafe
- ► Kiddie pool unable to meet ADA standards





- ► Pool plumbing and drain system issues
- Lifeguard stations do not meet OSHA standards
- ► Filtration system is at recommended retirement stage
- Cracks in pool vessel leak water 6,000 gallons per day
- Concrete vessel doesn't meet ADA standards

Project Schedule

The BUILD THE POOL project is a multi-phase project. The build schedule is designed to ensure a swimming pool will always be accessible during the swimming seasons.

March 2021 — Capital campaign launch. We need all hands on deck as we work to create an exceptional recreational experience in Darlington.

Fall 2022 — Ground breaking to complete phase 1 of the new pool. This includes the new bath house, pool vessel, and deck.

Summer 2023 – Pool opens

Fall 2023 — Pool features installed to complete the exceptional swim experience. Sun shades, splash pad, water slide, and zip line.
